# **FAMILY COUNSELLING**

20 MAY, 2023:

r. Madhu and Mr. Deepak visited a family residing in Burmanagar to discuss their familial issues. Upon arrival, we met with the family members and initiated a conversation about their ongoing problems.

The family is headed by Sriram and his wife, Kusum. Sriram, a self-made man, purchased land in Burmanagar over 20 years ago and has since made it their home. The couple has three sons: Rajaram, Venkataram, and Balaram. Rajaram is employed in a pipe company, earning Rs.40.000

per month, while Venkatram and Balaram earn Rs.30,000 per month each, the former through his auto business and the latter at a two-wheeler sales company.

Currently, Sriram is grappling with heart disease and diabetes, and Kusum is also in poor health. Sriram's condition prevents him from working, and despite their sons' financial capabilities, they have shown a lack of support towards their parents. Sriram's efforts to seek financial assistance from his sons for household maintenance and personal expenses have been repeatedly denied.

Driven to desperation, Sriram has taken legal action against his sons under the Senior Citizens and Maintenance Act. The aim is to secure financial support from them and, if necessary, evict them from his property.

After hearing their story, we offered counselling to the family and especially to the sons, emphasizing the importance of providing support to their parents. Following our discussion, the sons have agreed to help their parents, including renting out a room to generate additional income for household and personal expenses.

### FIELD EXPOSURE PROGRAM REPORT

(Migrant Workers in Ahmedabad and Rajasthan)

e embarked on a Field Exposure Program to Ahmedabad and Udaipur, with a primary focus on understanding the living and working conditions of migrant workers coming from other states. The visit was a golden opportunity to interact directly with the subjects of our study, offering us invaluable first hand insights into their challenges, strengths, and aspirations. The highlight of the trip was our visit to the Labour Union in Udaipur, organized by the Aajeevika Bureau.

### VISIT TO AAJEE-VIKA BUREAU LABOR UNION IN UDAIPUR

The Aajeevika Bureau is a notfor-profit organization that provides comprehensive services and resources to migrant workers, and it has been instrumental in forming the Labour Union in Udaipur. The union serves as a platform for migrant workers to voice their concerns, seek legal advice, and fight for their rights.

During our visit, we had the chance to interact with the bureau officials, who shared their experiences in the field. The passion they exhibited towards their work was inspiring, and their dedication to the cause of migrant workers was unquestionable.





#### OBSERVATIONS AT THE AAJEEVIKA BU-REAU OFFICE

The Aajeevika Bureau office is a hub of activity, with officials tirelessly working to improve the lives of migrant workers. We were given a tour of the office and an overview of the vari-

ous programs and services they offer.

The bureau focuses on providing legal and economic protection to migrant workers, but its work extends beyond that. They also run initiatives aimed at improving health and education among migrants and their families.

# INTERACTIONS WITH MIGRANT WORKERS:

We had the opportunity to speak directly with several migrant workers. Their stories were a mix of hardship, resilience, and hope. They expressed gratitude for organizations like the Aajeevika Bureau and the Labour Union, which provide much-needed support and avenues for assistance.

#### CONCLUSIONS

The exposure visit provided us with a comprehensive understanding of the conditions under which migrant workers live and work. It is clear that organizations like the Aajeevika Bureau play a vital role in advocating for the rights of this vulnerable population.



on our observations, we recommend expanding such support systems, and increasing awareness among migrant workers about their rights and the resources available to them. We also suggest that more research and resources should be dedicated to addressing the root causes of migration, such as rural poverty and lack of local

employment opportunities.

The Field Exposure Program was an eye-opening experience that underscored the need for continued focus and action on the issues faced by migrant workers. This experience has invigorated our commitment to contributing to this cause in whatever way we can.
