COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH INITIATIVE: HIV SCREENING AND AWARENESS PROGRAM IN MAMBAKKAM

19 JULY, 2024: MAMBAKKAM, CHENNAI.

n July 19, 2024, a comprehensive health initiative was conducted in Mambakkam, focusing on HIV screening and awareness. The program, a collaborative effort by the Tamil Nadu HIV Control Department, REIVAX, Real Charitable Trust, and the Social Welfare Department, aimed to provide critical health services and education to vulnerable populations, including migrants and adolescents.

HIV SCREENING

The event featured a rapid HIV screening for 50 migrants using the whole blood finger prick test, a quick and effective method for detecting HIV 1 and 2. The screening was conducted under the supervision of healthcare professionals, ensuring accuracy and confidentiality. Remarkably, no positive cases were identified during the screening, indicating a potentially low preva-



lence of HIV among the tested individuals. This outcome underscores the effectiveness of ongoing preventive measures and the importance of regular health check-ups.

AWARENESS SESSIONS

In addition to screening, the program included targeted awareness sessions for different groups:

Adolescent Boys:

A session was conducted for 30 adolescent boys, focusing on sexual health education, including the transmission, prevention, and importance of early detection of HIV/AIDS. The discussion aimed to equip them with knowledge and encourage responsible behaviors, thus reducing their risk of infection.

Female Migrants:

The Social Welfare Department, in collaboration with REIVAX and Real Charitable Trust, provided a dedicated awareness session for 13 female migrants. This session addressed the specific health challenges faced by women, particularly in migrant populations, and emphasized the importance of safe practices, regular health screenings, and the availability of healthcare resources.

CONCLUSION

The HIV screening and awareness program in Mambakkam successfully reached 93 participants, providing essential health services and education. The initiative highlighted the critical role of community health programs in preventing the spread of HIV and supporting the well-being of vulnerable populations. The absence of positive results in this screening session was a positive outcome, reflecting the community's current health status and the effectiveness of preventive strategies. This event was a significant step towards enhancing public health and empowering individuals with the knowledge and resources needed to lead healthier lives.





EMPOWERING THE MARGINALIZED: AWARENESS MEETING AND HEALTH CAMP IN MANALI

07 JULY, 2024: Manal, CHENNAI

n July 7, 2024, an impactful awareness meeting was held in Manali, specifically aimed at marginalized women, persons with disabilities (PwDs), and migrant communities. This event was organized by **Don Bosco Migrant Services** (DBMS) in collaboration with the Panchayat President of Manali. The program attracted 90 adult participants and 13 children, representing diverse groups including single women, PwDs, and migrants.

Key Focus Areas

Formation of Self-Help Groups (SHGs)

The meeting emphasized the formation of Self-Help Groups (SHGs) for different marginalized segments:

Single Mothers SHGs: The session focused on empowering single mothers by forming SHGs, which can provide mutual support, collective bargaining power, and a platform for sharing resources. The importance of economic independence through small-scale entrepreneurship and cooperative savings was highlighted, aiming to uplift their socio-economic status. **Migrants SHGs:** Migrants, often facing challenges in accessing local resources and services, were encouraged to form SHGs. These groups are crucial for building community networks, facilitating access to employment opportunities, and integrating more effectively into the local society. The program underscored the benefits of collective action and shared learning experiences.

PwDs SHGs: For persons with disabilities, SHGs are particularly vital in advocating for their rights and needs. The meeting discussed strategies to form these groups,

which would focus on skill development, accessible healthcare, and social inclusion. By organizing into SHGs, PwDs can better navigate the challenges posed by societal and physical barriers.

Medical Camp

Alongside the formation of SHGs, a medical camp was conducted to address the immediate healthcare needs of the participants. The camp provided free health checkups, basic medical consultations, and distributed essential medications. Special attention was given to the health concerns of single women, migrants, and PwDs, recognizing their often limited access to healthcare facilities. This initiative was crucial in promoting health awareness and preventive care among the attendees. **Sponsorship and Support**

The event was generously sponsored by DBMS and supported by the Panchayat PARTICIPANTS 90 adults 13 children

President of Manali. Their involvement was instrumental in mobilizing resources and ensuring the successful execution of the program. The sponsorship covered the costs of the medical camp, refreshments, and materials distributed to the participants.

Key provisions and the legal framework were discussed, including definitions of sexual harassment, the scope of the Act, and the obligations of employers and employees.


EMPLOYER'S RE-SPONSIBILITY TO EN-SURE A SAFE WORK-ING ENVIRONMENT

One of the core mandates under the POSH Act, as highlighted in Section 19(a), is the employer's duty to provide a safe working environment. This encompasses safety from any individual an employee might come into contact with at the workplace. The session stressed the importance of creating a culture of respect and safety, where employees feel secure and valued.



COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR OR-GANIZATIONS

The session underscored that all organizations, whether public or private, with 10 or more employees, are required to comply with the POSH Act. This includes not only permanent staff but also temporary, ad-hoc, consultants, interns, and contract workers, regardless of gender. The presentation outlined the specific requirements organizations must fulfill, such as forming an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) and conducting regular awareness programs.





REDRESSAL MECHANISM FOR COMPLAINTS

Employees were informed about the formal procedures for reporting sexual harassment, detailing how to file complaints and the process for their resolution. The session clarified the role of the ICC in handling complaints confidentially and impartially, ensuring that all cases are addressed with due seriousness and promptness.

PARTICIPATION AND FEEDBACK

A total of 48 employees, including two HR personnel, attended the session. Participants engaged actively, asking questions and discussing scenarios that helped clarify their understanding of the law and its application. The HR representatives expressed their commitment to implementing the session's teachings and enhancing the workplace environment..
