
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HEALTH AWARENESS PROGRAM ABHA CARD REGISTRATION CAMPAIGN

Event Highlights



COLLABORATIVE ACTION FOR ASSAM MIGRANTS: A STAKEHOLDER DIALOGUE AND CONSULTATION



he two-day consultation titled "Collaborative Action for Assam Migrants: A Stakeholder Dialogue and Consultation" was successfully held on March 20 – 21, 2025, at Don Bosco Institute, Kharguli, Guwahati, and Don Bosco H.S. Dibrugarh, Assam. School, This initiative aimed to bring together 100 key stakeholders and 10 migrant help desk delegates from Chennai, Coimbatore, Bangalore, Thiruvananthapuram, Gujarat, Goa, and Delhi to discuss and address the challenges faced by Assam's migrant workers in Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka. Maharashtra. Goa. Gujarat, and Delhi. The event sought to develop collaborative strategies for the welfare, rights, and protection of Assam's migrant workforce.

Day 1: March 20, 2025 – Stakeholders' Dialogue at Don Bosco Institute, Guwahati

The first day of the consultation was held at Don Bosco Institute, Kharguli, Guwahati, and commenced with a warm welcome and felicitation of all dignitaries and stakeholders by Ignatius Gari, Associate Director of Bosco Reach Out. Fr.Francis Bosco, In-Charge of the South Asia Migrant Ministry, presented a detailed analysis of migration trends from Assam to other Indian states. Shri Kanpai Das, Deputy Labour Commissioner of Assam, addressed the gathering as the Chief Guest, commending efforts to support Assam's migrant workers and ensuring labor rights Fr.AlbertThymiang, protection. Director of the Migrant Help Desk, Satgaon, facilitated discussions

and led delegation sharing sessions.Mr.Allen Brooks, Former Minority Commission Member of Assam, expressed gratitude for the collective commitment toward migrant welfare.

The consultation brought together 50 representatives from various civil society organizations, trade unions, religious groups, government agencies, and key stakeholders working on migration, labor rights, and social welfare. The discussion laid a strong foundation for collective action, focusing on enhancing the overall well-being of Assam's migrant workers in their destination states

A networking lunch followed the deliberations, providing an opportunity for stakeholders to interact and build collaborations. Special appreciation was extended to Fr. Ignatius and the staff of Bosco Reach Out for successfully organizing a meaningful stakeholders' dialogue in Guwahati, Assam.

Day 2: March 21, 2025 – Consultation at Don Bosco School, Dibrugarh

The second day of the consultation took place at Don Bosco H.S. School, Dibrugarh. The event commenced with a formal welcome and felicitation of dignitaries and DB4M migrant help desk delegates by Fr. BlasiusTete, Director of the Migrant Desk, Don Bosco Hijuguri, Tinsukia, Assam.Lighting of the kuthuvilakku by Fr. Nestor, Rector of Don Bosco School, Dibrugarh, Ex.Minister.Mr. Paban Singh, and Mr.WilfredTopno, marking the formal commencement of the consultation.Fr. Francis Bosco provided a contextual overview of Assam's migration trends and key determinant factors.Mr. Wilfred Topno, Secretary, People Action for Development Mission Baligaon, Gogamukh, Assam, gave an impactful presentation on child trafficking in tea gardens and the need to shape the future of Assam's children.Mr. Paban Singh Ghatowar, President of ACMS and former Union Minister, moderated the consultation deliberations, ensuring that key issues were addressed and strategic recommendations were formulated.Fr. RobertKujur, Dibrugarh Diocese Migrant Secretary, documented all suggestions and presented them for confirmation and endorsement by participants. Fr. Sunny Minj, Director Youth centre, Itanagar, extended a vote of thanks to all participants, emphasizing the need to take forward the action plan deliberated during the consultation. The session concluded with a community lunch, fostering further engagement among the attendees. Special thanks were conveyed to Fr. Blasius, Mr. PoresAind, Mr. LawrenceDhanwar, and the Don Bosco Community, Dibrugarh, for their commitment to organizing an impactful consultation on Assam's migration issues.

Following the consultation, the DB4M delegates visited Khwune Tea Garden in Sibsagar district, Assam. The visit aimed to engage with tea garden workers, understanding their issues and challenges, while also sharing insights about the difficulties faced by Assam migrants in their destination states. This interactive visit facili-

tated direct engagement between Tea garden workers and DB4M delegates, strengthening the linkage between Assam (source region) and the various destination states where Assam migrants seek livelihoods.

The two-day consultation served as an essential platform for dialogue and collaboration among stakeholders, migrant workers, and policymakers. Strengthening migrant help desks in both source and destination regions. Key takeaways of the consultation were -Addressing issues of child trafficking in tea estates, Ensuring policy advocacy for labor rights and social security measures for Assam migrants and Enhancing collaborative efforts between government, civil society, and faithbased organizations.

The stakeholders' dialogue and consultation successfully paved the way for a coordinated response to safeguard the rights, welfare, and dignity of Assam's migrant workers. Special appreciation goes out to all Don Bosco for Migrants (DB4M) help desk delegates for their proactive involvement in strengthening the link between Assam and destination states.





ADDICTION AND DEPRESSION AWARENESS PROGRAM

MARCH - 01- 2025:

he "Addiction and Depression Awareness Program" was successfully held on 1st March 2025 at the OMR Migrant Labour Colony, Chennai. The event was organized by Don Bosco Migrant Services with the support of Don Bosco Brothers from Kavarapettai. This awareness program aimed to address the critical issues of addiction and depression, both of which are growing concerns in communities across the nation. The program was attended by 180 participants, primarily sisting of individuals from the migrant labor community, and sought to inform them about mental health, addiction, and depression, along with preventive strategies and available support systems.

Objectives of the Program

The main objectives of the program were as follows:

- 1. Raise Awareness: Increase awareness about the prevalence and impact of addiction and depression within the community.
- 2. Mental Health Education: Educate participants about the symptoms, causes, and consequences of addiction and depression.
- 3. Prevention and Support: Highlight methods of prevention and available support structures for those struggling with mental health issues.
- 4. Empowerment: Empower participants with practical knowledge to seek help and create a healthier, more supportive community.

Program Overview

The program began at 10:00 AM with an introduc-

tory speech, welcoming the participants and emphasizing the importance of mental health awareness. The session proceeded with a series of talks, presentations, and interactive discussions that focused on the following key themes:

- Understanding Addiction and Depression: The session provided a comprehensive overview of what addiction and depression are, how they affect individuals and communities, and the importance of early intervention.
- Identifying the Signs: Trained professionals discussed the signs and symptoms of addiction and depression, equipping participants with the knowledge to recognize these conditions in themselves and others.
- Impact on Migrant Communities: Special attention was

given to how addiction and depression affect migrant laborers, particularly those dealing with the stress of relocation, work pressures, and isolation from families.

- Prevention Strategies: The program provided practical strategies for preventing addiction and depression, such as maintaining a balanced lifestyle, engaging in supportive social networks, and accessing professional help.
- Support Systems: Participants were informed about local and national resources, including counseling services, rehabilitation centers, and community support groups.

Keynote Speakers

The program featured a series of experienced speakers from the mental health sector. The keynote address was delivered by a prominent expert in mental health who spoke on the effects of addiction and depression on individuals and their communities. Other speakers included mental health counselors, social workers, and representatives from local NGOs working on mental health issues

Interactive Sessions

To enhance engagement and understanding, interactive sessions were conducted where participants could ask questions, share personal stories, and engage with the speakers. These sessions

The session had a positive impact on the participants, helping them feel more empowered to manage their mental well-being.

LEGAL DRAFTING WORKSHOP ORGANIZED BY THE LABOUR MIGRATION UNIT

MARCH - 19 - 2025:

Introduction:

workshop on legal drafting was conducted by the Labour Migration Unit at the Indian Social Institute in Bengaluru from 17th to 19th March 2025. The workshop aimed to enhance the skills of participants in legal drafting, with a particular focus on issues related to labor migration. The event was attended by various professionals in the field. including a staff member from Don Bosco Migrant Services, who actively participated in the sessions.

Workshop Overview:

The three-day workshop covered a range of essential topics related to legal drafting. The sessions were designed to provide participants with a deeper understanding of the legal processes and the necessary skills to draft various legal documents. Key topics included the fundamentals of legal drafting, the importance of clarity, precision, and structure in legal writing, and how these elements apply in practical scenarios.

Key Topics Discussed:

One of the main topics covered was the drafting of police complaints and First Information Reports (FIRs). The workshop provided detailed guidance on how



to prepare these documents effectively to ensure that the law enforcement authorities understand the issues at hand. Another important subject discussed was the filing of complaints with the Human Rights Commission, which provided valuable insights into how migrant workers can seek justice for rights violations.

Furthermore, the workshop covered the process preparing affidavits, petitions, and witness statements. emphasizing the correct format and language required to ensure these documents are legally sound. The participants were also trained in handling evidence and supporting documents, a crucial part of the legal process, ensuring that claims and complaints are wellsupported and substantiated.

Learning Outcomes:

Participants, including the staff member from Don Bosco Migrant Services, gained practical skills in drafting legal documents. The training provided deeper understanding the importance of accurate documentation in the legal processes involving migrant workers. It also improved their ability to assist migrant workers in filing complaints and seeking legal redress, a critical area of support in their roles.

Conclusion:

The workshop on legal drafting proved to be highly beneficial for all participants, equipping them with the skills necessary to navigate the legal challenges faced by migrant workers. The sessions, led by experts in the field, successfully met the objectives of enhancing legal drafting skills and raising awareness about the legal avenues available to migrant workers. It is expected that the knowledge gained from this workshop will empower the staff members to offer better support to migrant workers in their legal matters.

NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF UNORGANIZED LABORERS

MARCH - 20,21 - 2025:

Introduction:

The National Federation of Unorganized and Migrant Workers (NFUMW) successfully organized the National Conference of Representatives of Unorganized Laborers in New Delhi on March 20th and 21st, 2025. This event brought together representatives from across India to discuss critical issues related to unorganized labor, migrant workers, and the challenges they face in the country's workforce. A total of 72 participants from Tamil Nadu, including a staff member from Don Bosco Migrant Services, were present at the conference.

Key Objectives of the Conference:

The primary aim of this conference was to address the pressing issues affecting unorganized

laborers, including migrant workers, with a focus on their rights, welfare, and the need for structural reforms to improve their working conditions. The conference provided a platform for sharing knowledge, advocating for policy changes, and strategizing on ways to unite and empower workers from marginalized sectors.

Keynote Address and Discussion Topics:

One of the notable speakers at the conference was the staff member from Don Bosco Migrant Services, who discussed several important aspects concerning migrant workers. The following points were highlighted during his presentation:

1.Unification of Workers:

Emphasis was placed on the need for organizing migrant and unorganized workers into strong unions to ensure collective bargaining power. The speaker stressed that unity among workers is essential to safeguard their rights and interests.

2.Medical and Employee State Insurance Benefits:

A significant portion of the discussion was dedicated to the inadequate access to healthcare and social security benefits for unorganized workers. The speaker urged for the expansion of Employee State Insurance (ESI) and the implementation of affordable and accessible healthcare programs for all unorganized workers, particularly migrants.

3.Monetary Assistance and Financial Security:

Another critical point raised was the lack of financial security for migrant workers, who often face delays in wages and are





not entitled to adequate compensation during periods of unemployment or illness. The speaker called for the introduction of monetary assistance schemes to provide financial stability to workers during times of crisis.

4. Housing and Worker Welfare Programs:

Housing conditions for migrant workers, especially in urban areas, were highlighted as a major concern. The speaker advocated for affordable housing schemes and the creation of safe living conditions for migrant laborers. Furthermore, there was a call for improved worker welfare programs, focusing on ensuring basic amenities such as sanitation and access to education for migrant families.

5. Challenges Faced by Migrant Workers:

Migrant workers often 0 face numerous challenges, including exploitation, poor working conditions, lack of job security, and vulnerability to abuse. The speaker elaborated on the urgent need to address these issues through comprehensive labor laws and protections for workers in the unorganized sector.

6.Workers' Rights and Legal Protections:

The discussion also focused on strengthening legal protections for workers in the unorganized sector. The speaker advocated for the effective implementation of labor laws that ensure fair wages, safe working environments, and protection against exploitation, with particular emphasis on ensuring that migrant workers are not denied their basic rights. 7.Improved Working

Conditions:

One of the key demands highlighted was the improvement of working conditions for unorganized laborers, particularly in sectors such as construction, domestic work, and agriculture. The need for better safety standards, reduced working hours, and proper compensation for overtime was emphasized.

Outcomes and Recommendations:

The discussions at the conference led to the formulation of several key recommendations, including:

1.Creation of Stronger Worker Unions:

A call for the formation of stronger unions that can advocate for the rights of unorganized and migrant workers, providing them with a platform to voice their concerns and negotiate better working conditions.

2. Expansion of Healthcare and **Insurance Coverage:**

The government and employers were urged to expand healthcare and insurance benefits to include migrant workers and other unorganized laborers, ensuring that these workers have access to necessary medical services and financial security in times of need

3.Introduction of Welfare Schemes:

There was a unanimous call for the introduction of comprehensive worker welfare programs, including affordable housing, childcare facilities, and educational opportunities for migrant workers and their families.

4. Stronger Legal Protections:

The need for stronger legal frameworks to protect migrant workers and ensure fair treatment was emphasized. Participants called for the implementation of existing labor laws and the creation of new policies to protect workers from exploitation.

5.Monitoring and Enforcement:

Participants agreed on the importance of setting up monitoring mechanisms to ensure that existing laws and welfare schemes are effectively implemented. This would include the establishment of local grievance redressal systems to address worker complaints promptly.

Conclusion:

The National Conference of Representatives of Unorganized Laborers was a vital platform for highlighting the struggles and challenges faced by unorganized and migrant workers in India. The discussions recommendations and that emerged from the conference are essential for shaping future labor policies and ensuring that the rights and welfare of migrant workers are safeguarded. Moving forward, it is imperative that the government, employers, and worker organizations collaborate to implement the necessary reforms to improve the lives of unorganized laborers and create a more inclusive workforce in India.
