E-Shram Enrollment and Registration Drives

E-Shram Enrollment for Unorganized Workers in Manali (20-22 May 2022)

Don Bosco Migrant Services (DBMS) held a free E-Shram enrollment camp enrolling 215 migrant workers, providing access to government accident compensation and pension schemes. Supported by government officials, DBMS staff, and local teachers.

E-Shram Card Camp – 20th May 2022
Registration camp at Mamabakkam enrolling 15 migrant workers.

E-Shram Registration Drive – 15th July 2022

DBMS registered around 20 construction workers with CSC department support, noting many were already enrolled but unaware of their status.

E-Shram Registration at Vallakottai
Facilitated registration for 37 TNUHDB construction ISM labourers with support from Fr. Roshan and MSW students.

Meeting with Construction Labourers on E-Shram Registration

– 22nd August 2022

Provided info on E-Shram registration and plans to assist those without bank accounts.

Medical Camp and E-Shram Registration Programme at TNHB Toad Hunter Nagar – 25th August 2022

Over 80 labourers received medical checkups and E-Shram registration assistance.

E-Shram Registration Camp and Labour Welfare Programme – 11th October 2022, Ernavur
Benefited 25 labourers with registration and a welfare program covering labour laws, de-addiction, HIV awareness, and first aid.



HEALTH AND HYGIENE PROGRAMS

01

Healthcare Awareness Program – 24th April 2022, Mambakkam

50 migrant workers attended sessions on personal hygiene, cleanliness, and healthcare, supported by MSW students.

03

Healthcare and Hygiene Program – 15th May 2022, Mamabakkam Village

30 migrant workers from Assam and Orissa received training on personal care, cleanliness, and emergency first aid.

Medical Camp for Irular Community at Sadayankuppam – 19th November 2022

45 families received medical check-ups and awareness sessions on common illnesses and diabetes.

Healthcare and Hygiene Program – 8th May 2022

Program for 30 migrant workers from Jharkhand covering hygiene, PF numbers, and union formation.

LABOUR WELFARE PROGRAMS AND SAFETY AWARENESS INITIATIVES (2022)



KEY FOCUS AREAS ACROSS PROGRAMS

Safety Awareness and Equipment Use

Workers were educated on construction site safety practices, the importance of personal protective equipment (PPE), and participated in live demonstrations on first aid and emergency response.

Legal Literacy and Welfare Registration

Sessions covered key labour legislations including the Building and Other Construction Workers (BOCW) Act and Inter-State Migrant Workmen (ISMW) Act. Support for E-Shram card registration and other welfare enrolments was provided, ensuring better access to social security schemes.

In 2022, a series of Labour Welfare and **Programs** Safety **Awareness** conducted across various construction sites in Chennai, reaching over 800 workers. These initiatives were designed enhance the well-being, to awareness, and safety of migrant and local labourers through multi-faceted support services and engagement activities.

Health and Medical Support

Free medical camps were organized, addressing common health issues among workers. Special emphasis was placed on HIV/AIDS awareness, de-addiction counseling, and sanitation practices, highlighting the importance of preventive healthcare.



Irular Community Receives Free Land Pattas – 26th November 2022

DBMS has supported the Irular community, previously bonded laborers forced to work in poor conditions near Kosas Thalai river. After years of struggle and protests, with DBMS's help, they applied for land rights.

On 26th November 2022, the Thiruvallur Collector distributed free land pattas to 35 Irular families in a ceremony attended by officials and villagers. This marked a historic moment as the community finally secured their own land and a better future.





EDUCATION & CHILDREN WELFARE

Over the past few years, Don Bosco Migrant Services (DBMS) has been at the forefront of empowering migrant and underprivileged communities across Chennai and beyond. Through a wide array of initiatives—including educational programs, health and hygiene camps, cultural celebrations, sports tournaments, and leadership workshops—DBMS strives to uplift children, youth, and families facing economic hardship, social exclusion, and irregular access to basic services. Our commitment extends from ensuring continuous education in brick kiln areas to fostering civic engagement and promoting personal development in evening study centres. Below is a categorized overview of DBMS's key activities and events, illustrating the scope and impact of our holistic outreach efforts.

Summer Camp at Sadayankuppam and Burma Nagar (May 8-11, 2022):

100 children from seven study centres participated in group activities, games, a cooking contest, and a prize distribution. The camp concluded with thanks and snacks.

Summer Camp Reflection:

Reflections from teaching at Kannagi Nagar Government School highlighted the calling to serve the needy and be a Good Samaritan. Experiences with slum children were moving, exposing discrimination and neglect.

ACTIVITIES FOR MIGRANT CHILDREN AND LABOURERS



Drawing & Singing Competitions (March-April 2022):

- Drawing competition (Apr 27):
 10 migrant children at
 Mambakkam participated.
- Singing competition (Apr 13):
 Held for nine tuition-attending migrant children.



Visit to Migrant Families & Study Centre:

Discussions with families revealed financial issues, lack of documents, and irregular school attendance. Efforts continue to support education.



Migrant Labourers Meeting (Mar 3, 2022):

Interaction with Jharkhand migrant labourers revealed low wages and desire for stable employment.



Migrant Children School Enrollment Visits:

Focused on Burma Nagar,
Pudu Nagar, and
Sadayankuppam; parents
faced challenges due to
documents and
awareness.

In 2022-2023, over 500 children across multiple locations celebrated festivals, educational events, and cultural programs featuring games, swimming, motivational talks, and civic learning, supported by community sponsors and local centres.



One-Day Picnic - Queen's Land (June 11, 2022): Over 150 children from evening study centres enjoyed games and swimming, supported by DB Egmore and St. Bede's.



Independence Day Celebrations (14-15 August 2022): Cultural programs and games were held in Thiruvallur and Perumbakkam for 184 children. Chief guests and sponsors distributed materials and encouragement.



Children's Day Celebrations:

Arenari School and Mambakkam village on November 17th, 2022 featured games and motivational talks for 150 children.



Christmas Celebrations (23-24 Dec 2022):

Celebrations held at Sadayankuppam, OMR, and Thiruvallur regions. Included gifts, sweets, messages of hope, and festive activities.



Pongal Celebrations (Jan 2022 & 2023):

Events held at Saddayankuppam Irular Village and in OMR, Thiruvallur. Children participated in traditional games and cultural performances.



Constitution Day - Sadayankuppam (28 Nov 2023):

50 children celebrated by reading the Preamble, learning values, and understanding civic responsibility.



YOUTH EMPOWERMENT THROUGH SPORTS

1) Volleyball Tournaments and Matches

- Kannagi Nagar (22 Jan 2023): DBMS organized a lively volleyball tournament with six teams, where Rentu Adukku Challai won, promoting teamwork and youth empowerment under the guidance of Fr. Vincent and Fr. Bosco.
- Periyapalayam (29 Jan 2023): In celebration of Don Bosco's feast, a knockout volleyball tournament with seven teams saw Mettupalayam emerge champions, supported by Fr. Bosco, Fr. Vincent, and local youth volunteers.
- Sadayankuppam Irular Youth Match (26 Feb 2023): A friendly match at Don Bosco Ennore between Sadayankuppam Irular youth and Ennore Oratory ended in victory for the Irular team, fostering community spirit and youth engagement.

2) Football Match for ISM Construction Workers - 30th October 2022

DBMS organized a football match for 40 migrant workers, with West Bengal FC winning 3-2 against Star-studded Jharkhand, followed by a traditional dance, emphasizing the value of leisure for worker well-being.



EDUCATION FOR MIGRANT AND SEASONAL CHILDREN

Brick Chamber Labourers in Kanchipuram and

Tiruvalluvar: Many children miss school due to migration.
DBMS enrolled children at 10 sites with Odia teachers; government support was lacking.

Brick Kiln Children School Enrollment 2022-23:

- Schools reopened between Jan 31 to Feb 16, enrolling over 440 children.
- Odia-speaking EVs appointed; education in mother tongue ensured.



Pudhuvayil Region Initiative:

- 13 study centers
 established near brick kilns
 for 400 children.
- 13 education volunteers trained in a seminar on Feb 11, 2023.

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Migrant Children's Education – Pudhuvayil Region

DBMS established 13 study centers near Pudhuvayil, serving around 400 migrant children from brick kiln families, supported by 13 education volunteers. A seminar in February 2023 trained volunteers in effective teaching methods.

Brick Kiln Enrollment

- **Puduvoyal School:** 165 children from 5 chambers, supported by 5 Odia-speaking volunteers.
- Pallikapettai School: 65 children from 1 chamber, with 2 Odia volunteers.
- **Pondovakkam School:** 116 children from 3 chambers, taught by 5 Odia volunteers.
- Vadakanallur School: 44 children from 3 chambers.
- **Kilmudalamedu School:** 12 children enrolled despite initial employer resistance, with 1 volunteer.
- Akravakkam School: 40 children from 1 chamber, supported by 2 Odia volunteers.





- SMC Meeting and Kalaivizha Sadayankuppam (Nov 25, 2022): Addressed child safety and regular attendance. Children showcased talents and were encouraged by Sr. Malliga.
- Night School Teachers Meeting (Jul 6, 2022): Held at DBMS
 Office; included monthly report review, picnic feedback, salary distribution, and planning.
- Visit to Illam Thedy Kalvi Study Centre: Teachers reported irregular attendance. August drawing competition plans were discussed.

Student Internships, Research, and Collaboration



Internships & Field Placements:

DBMS has hosted numerous MSW interns for immersive fieldwork. In April 2022, four second-year students from RGNIYD began with a comprehensive orientation by Fr. Nirmal, followed by practical training in survey methods at Mambakkam and a site visit to the SIPCOT office in Sriperumbadur. By July 2022, these students also conducted classes and grassroots surveys under official BEO permission, deepening their understanding of migrant communities.



Research Collaborations: Partnering with St. Joseph College, DBMS led a micro-survey on migrant socioeconomic conditions in Villupuram and Kallakurichi, guiding 30 MSW students and faculty through interviews with 130 respondents. Concurrently, a month-long survey team based at Don Bosco Gedilam mapped living conditions and livelihood patterns across multiple villages.



Immersion & Exposure Programs: student Beyond interns. **DBMS** coordinated week-long immersions for clergy and theology students. In April 2022. priests from Dimapur experienced field ministry among construction sites and union meetings. Later that year, four deacons and 36 seminary students underwent structured exposure program covering bonded street outreach, contexts, and migrant construction sites.

Institutional Learning & Staff Events:

To reinforce internal capacity, DBMS organizes regular staff engagements: placement drives at RGNIYD; monthly meetings to review field reports and launch the Migrant Voice magazine; the foundation ceremony for the new **DBMS** building; Benefactors' celebrations; and targeted training for study centre teachers. A provincial Social Commission meeting further priorities aligned strategic across Chennai and Trichy provinces.

Workshops & Consultations: DBMS convened key sector dialogues, including the Tamil Nadu Migrant Commission meeting at TASOSS, an occupational health and safetv consultation in Chennai, and a pastoral animation at Krishtu Jyothi College. Foundational gatherings like the Salesian Social Forum and a migration workshop for provided Redemptorist Brothers platforms for policy discourse and best-practice sharing.

Advocacy, Protests, and Legal Actions





Community Outreach & Advocacy

In April 2022, during a 14-day immersion in Anna Nagar and Adambakkam, the team engaged with around 150 migrant laborers to address wage disputes—successfully resolving a pending case at Cake-Point—and participated in a major protest against the new Labour Codes, advocating for unorganized workers' rights.



Protests & Demonstrations


On 22 April 2022, DBMS joined a unified protest at Villupuram's Collectorate against the Centre's new labour codes, condemning the repeal of 44 labour laws and demanding implementation of the Tamil Nadu Manual Workers Act, 1982, culminating in a memorandum submission.





Fact-Finding & Justice Campaigns

Following the tragic death of Kamothram - a migrant worker killed at SKM Animal Feed Ltd. on 6 April 2022—DBMS led a fact-finding mission on 13 April and a press meet on 11 May, calling for an independent investigation, judicial inquiry, release of arrested workers, and systemic safety reforms.





Site Visits & Worker Insights

Regular visits to SIPCOT and brick chamber sites (26 April 2022) provided first-hand understanding of harsh work conditions, wage structures, and child engagement—informing DBMS's advocacy and program design.
